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BUS SAFETY REMINDERS

Parents, here are a few reminders to discuss with your children about riding the bus. In just the fourth week of school, we have had a number of behaviors reported.

- 1. While at the bus stop, wait in a safe place. Do not run and play while waiting. Drivers have reported children in the street and not waiting safely on the sidewalk.
- 2. Sit facing forward on bus at all times. Some students are sitting on their knees and moving in the aisle of the bus. These are major safety concerns.
- 3. Talk quietly so the bus driver will not be distracted. Shouting and yelling can distract the driver.
- 4. Keep your hands to yourself. We have had reports that students are playing tag on the bus.
- 5. Make sure you have all of your belongings when you get off of the bus. Backpacks, lunch boxes, and clothing have been left behind on buses.
