Educational Presentations

Dr. Macharola advised the board is asked to take a look at the second reading of policy 610 that was shared earlier with the increases.

Questions/Comments/Concerns:

Mr. Nelson asked if those increases actually made a difference. Mr. Boland responded that they did not.

Committee Report

A. Berks County Intermediate Unit - Mr. J. Tony Lupia, Jr.

There were no meetings last month, all 29 intermediate units across Pennsylvania have been celebrating their 50th anniversary. In honor of that, BCIU has several things they are going to be doing this year. One is an anniversary webpage which was launched on January 6th, and it includes special edition videos, testimonials, comments about the organization from staff, school officials, and community partners. The timeline of notable accomplishments,

leadership, facts and historical phots gathered from the BCIU's rich history. There is a dedicated social media campaign which includes Fact Fridays, can be followed along on BCIU's Facebook page, and accessed on YouTube. There will be billboards throughout the county and the BCIU Signature Anniversary Event will be held Thursday, April 21st, 2022, 5PM to 6PM before the April BCIU Board Meeting. Final details will be at the next meeting.

B. Reading-Muhlenberg CTC - Mrs. Cindy Mengle

Mrs. Mengle advised there was the Annual Reorganization Meeting on Monday night which was supposed to be a dinner, however the dinner was postponed to another date. Mrs. Mengle advised she will inform the board members of this date when available. New board members were seated, three new board members from Reading, one being a former secretary from Muhlenberg, Pat Law. One of the things discussed was the website was now updated. They are going to try and get the students involved in the design and upkeep of the website as this will be a good learning experience for them.

C. Berks County Tax Collection Committee - Mr. Shane M. Mathias, CPA

Mr. Mathias reported there was a meeting, meeting with the TCC on the 16th of December. There is quite a few things the committee approved including the 2022 Berks EIT Operating and Capital Budget, the election of officers for 2022 which were unchanged from 2021, and the final thing of note is the committee approved Herbein & Co. as the financial statement auditors for the next three years of audits which would be for fiscal years ending December 31st, 2021, 2022, and 2023.

D. PSBA Liaison - Mr. Otto W. Voit, III

There is no report at this time.

E. Muhlenberg Community Library - Mr. Terry Heckman

Mr. Lupia reported that Melissa Adams was hired as Reading's new head of Reading Public Libraries, congratulations to her, this was as step up.

F. Educational Programs - Dr. Alan S. Futrick

There is no report at this time.

Solicitor's Comments - Mr. Brian F. Boland, Esq.

There is no report at this time.

Superintendent's Comments - Dr. Joseph E. Macharola

Dr. Macharola advised he would like to revisit as there will be more data next month for the community as the District continues to work for the kids. He stated we are here for one reason, one central reason, and that is our children and our young adults or anyone who attends Muhlenberg School District. He talked about in twenty-two months, the District dealt with a lot of abnormalcy and this is coming to head with him in many ways. He just wants the Board to be aware of it, as he knows they are, and he knows the community is, as irritated as some people got when he kept talking about mental health and the importance of counseling and therapy. This issue is continuing to morph and grow in ways that is very concerning to him. He said you can live a life, you can do the things that you want to do, you can be a reasonable human being, you can be unreasonable, you can act like you have authoritative qualifications and have none, there are so many things you can do as a life form on this planet. He spoke about being a great person that has done things in their life and wants to contribute and try to help. The arena of life and living, he stated as he is concerned about the adults, but overwhelming concerned about the children. He was in two meeting this month, one was with the other eighteen Superintendents in Berks County, but he is also part of the Penn Study council where he speaks with Superintendents of Delaware, New Jersey, and Eastern Pennsylvania, and he has spent some time talking about how close the Districts here are to a disaster. He spoke about 70 of the District's children during the first wave of this pandemic, of these 70 children the District were able to identify needed clinical therapeutic assistance. The District had so many children here that were contemplating suicide, and he has never had anything like this in his career; and he would stop and think about all the abnormalcy, the craziness, the things that are said, who takes the most God-awful positions when it comes to health and safety when the number one things he is worried about is the kids being here, and it's very serious. So serious, one of the things the District talked about hiring is the need to get back into more therapy in our school system and start doing things that are very important for the kids. 39% of the District's students reported feeling depressed during the past twelve months for two weeks or more in a row that is up from 12% just two years ago. 48% of the District's 12th graders reported feeling depressed every day for two weeks, this number is mind blowing because there hasn't been psychosocial evaluations being done on these kids; and the criteria is part of the DSM 5 diagnosis for the depressed disorder. 22% of the District's students reported seriously considering suicide over the last year, 5% in 2019. 16.5% of the District's students surveyed reported making a plan for suicide. 19% of the District's 8th graders reported having attempted suicide. Dr. Macharola talked about moving some people around because he thought they would be good mentors for the kids. Dr. Macharaola stated this is data, this is not subjective; these are kids reaching out and telling us. He knows this is true because he knows what occurred with those that were identified; what about all the kids that are flying underneath the radar are concerning him. Dr. Macharola advised they talk about everything, they talk about things that are important, what is so important is the sanctity of life, and that the children and young adults are here. He is really concerned about the faculty and staff, but the number one concern as a district is the children. The District is taking steps to address this. Dr. Macharola discussed the Nov/Dec PSBA Bulletin, whereas for twenty-two months he has been mentioning mental health; if feeling depressed go out and meet somebody, hour-byhour, minute-by-minute, hour-by-hour, day-by-day as the issues arise, so does the District's answers. This has been consistent in the District's eyes here with mental

health. There are articles in the bulletin with concerns of the mental health of the students. Muhlenberg, his backyard, he is worried about his country, worried about where it's going, worried about the democracy. Dr. Macharola talked about peeling all that back, he is worried about now, and has been, the welfare of the children. This many kids considering this, the District has its counselors engaged, there is a mental health program that the District started this year K-12, probably one of the only school districts in the state that has piloted these programs that have delivered results for the school district. Math, Science, the Board has invested millions into technology; nothing is more important than the mental health and the social-emotional welfare of the kids, especially when he sees these alarming numbers. He wanted to ask everyone present to embrace this, it is serious, and this is not going to go away. This is going to continue to emerge as the District continues to deal with the abnormalcies. The information that is out there for people, the social media, the hate, the misinformation. Too many people making the most God-awful recommendations in positions as the kids soak this up, they hear this, they live it; it's taking a toll. This is just an overview of this, he is going to give everyone a more extensive report. He is going to have Dr. Futrick, with the District's Behavior Specialist, Zach Milch, the District is going to take some very serious steps to get our arms around this even more so. One in four of the District's students have witnessed death, suicide, and serious illness from COVID-19; one in four in the children's households to that extent with serious, serious complications that has caused stress in their homes. So anybody that thinks this is "boloney" and thinks they have answers to it, he is looking at it from a much different perspective than what maybe they are. This is not a game. This information just came to the District after the results and the District is going to crunch more numbers and get them out. Dr. Macharola wanted to thank the Board for their support with the kids over the last twenty-two months of abnormalcy. The District will get through this, the District needs to stay positive.

Mrs. Eagle questioned if a lot of those numbers were self-reported. Dr. Macharola responded yes. Mrs. Eagle asked what a place in the community is so that the community members and the parents know, as she is thinking in regards to the SAP program, so they can report back to the District of the things they are seeing; or is it something that the District has to work on. Dr. Macharola responded this is something the District has to do better at. It is on the District's website, there are the numbers to call where you can directly get in contact, but the District has to find a way to even do better. Dr. Macharola discussed a personal incident that he had shared with Mr. Lupia, right after being two hours on the phone with a youngster that was going to be a suicide/homicide and the authorities were involved, but it was two hours in the evening as a Superintendent. This is real stuff, and he takes it real seriously. Dr. Macharola asked the Board for their help, the community's help, to try and keep everyone here.

Dr. Macharola wanted to let Mr. Nelson know of the clarification regarding college students and the Winter Style program as they are working during the day at the school also, to help the students with reading. Mr. Nelson questioned whether during the day was causing any issues. Dr. Macharola responded not at this time and not from a lawful standpoint. They have clearances, they have their vaccinations, went through professional development and would be the same thing they did in the summer. Dr. Macharola advised he had a little heartburn in the beginning about it, however he

believes everything will be okay; and if it doesn't fly then the District is not going to do it again. Anything to help the students that need that remediation.

Mr. Lupia questioned if any Board member is approached by a community member with questions about mental health or this regard, should they encourage them to call the school or what should they tell them. Dr. Macharola responded yes, and if they are asking questions with regard to what the District is doing then the District can certainly make a statement. If they are suffering from depression and concerns, or they need to reach out, the District has a Licensed Behavioral Specialist present. Dr. Macharola talked about the District needing four more, the District is adding social workers presently, and the need is unbelievable. For kids to do well in school, there are bridges that you never would have never thought of ten or fifteen years ago, but this is what everyone lives in now; it's not going to go away and if they need help, yes get ahold of the District and the District will get them what they need.

Mr. Hyneman commented that this is not a Muhlenberg problem, this is a country wide problem. Everyone has been impacted by this and it is hard for him to put himself into a very young person's mental issues. When he grew up in the 40's and 50's he dealt with "Ozzie and Harriet", they have a totally different world and he has a hard time understanding what a little seven year old is going through and it breaks his heart. He has trouble thinking about his grandkids not having the life growing up that he had, or their parents had.
