Committee Reports

A. Berks County Intermediate Unit - Mr. Randall R. Madara

Mr. Madara reported that a meeting was held on April 16th. A copy of *What Happened at the BCIU Board Meeting* was included in the packet this month. They holding their meetings via Zoom as well.

B. Reading-Muhlenberg CTC - Mrs. Cindy L. Mengle

Mrs. Mengle reported the Committee approved the final budget at their Zoom meeting on Monday, May 8th. Muhlenberg's increase is 14.02%. The District also has an increase in enrollment, which is the highest over the last ten years - 1,259 total students attending the RMCTC for next year.

C. Berks County Tax Collection Committee – Mr. Shane M. Mathias/Mr. Otto W. Voit, III

Mr. Mathias said there was no meeting this month due to COVID-19.

D. PSBA Liaison - Mr. Otto W. Voit, III

E. Muhlenberg Community Library - Mr. Terry Heckman/Mr. Randall R. Madara

Mr. Madara read the following report submitted by Mr. Terry Heckman from their Monday, May 8th Zoom meeting:

Through the hardworking tenacious efforts of Library Director, Melissa Adams, she was able to secure a Federal PPP loan in the amount of \$30,976 to keep the library fiscally afloat in these very financially turbulent times. As long as the Library expends 75% of this money on staff payroll within eight weeks of receipt, the loan will be forgiven – DONE. Great job, Melissa!

The Library continues to provide the community with a vast array of virtual programs for every age group. Please check the library's website for specific details.

All summer reading programs will also need to be presented on a virtual basis.

The Library will open for one day on June 2nd - Election Day - but only for the purpose of voting - no actual library activities.

The Library's spending will decrease for the purchase of print items during this time but increase in the purchase of children's Launchpad's.

With all of the losses mounting for the Library from the many cancelled fundraising initiatives they had planned this Spring, future more aggressive fundraising efforts will be necessary once they actually return and could become vital for their very survival.

F. Muhlenberg Township/Laureldale Borough Liaison - Mr. J. Tony Lupia, Jr.

Mr. Lupia said he had nothing to report at this time as the Township is not allowing any visitors. If anyone would like to view their meeting, they can access it via YouTube by entering Muhlenberg Township Commissioners meeting.

G. Educational Programs - Dr. Alan S. Futrick

Dr. Futrick said he wanted to give an update on how the District is doing its best during the really terrible situation it is in educationally. Administrators always say that teachers make the difference and he wanted to commend the leadership of the grade level leaders, department chairs and administrators. The collaboration of ideas, the strategies and the activities have been exceptional. He said he thinks teachers have really shown their true character and how great they are through this time. Dr. Futrick said he is very proud of them and very proud of the work that the teachers and administrators have done through this.

Solicitor's Comments - Mr. Brian F. Boland

No report at this time.

Superintendent's Comments - Dr. Joseph Macharola

Dr. Macharola thanked Dr. Futrick for his comments and his work as well making the best of a pretty difficult situation.

Dr. Macharola recognized Muhlenberg High School chemistry teacher, Mrs. Jarra Rusnock Dennis, an Albright College graduate, who will be inducted into the Middle Atlantic Conference (MAC) Hall of Fame. Mrs. Dennis has been selected to be inducted into the MAC Hall of Fame for her outstanding athletic career while attending Albright. Jarra remains the all-time leading scorer in Albright's basketball history. Mrs. Dennis played basketball, softball and tennis while attending Albright from 1994-1998. She earned four varsity letters for each sport and was named Team Most Valuable Player in each one at least once. Mrs. Dennis becomes the tenth former Albright athlete to be inducted into the MAC Hall of Fame. Dr. Macharola said what an honor that is and on top of that, she is an incredible chemistry teacher. He said congratulations to Muhlenberg High School chemistry teacher and Albright grad, Jarra Rusnock Dennis.

Dr. Macharola wanted to recognize two other coaches. One of those coaches is a magnificent teacher at C. E. Cole Intermediate School, Mr. Matt Coldren. Mr. Coldren has been named the 6A Boys' Basketball Coach of the Year. Matt coaches at Wilson High School. Dr. Macharola said he is very proud of Mr. Coldren and his accomplishments. He also wanted to take a moment to congratulate Coach Tyrone Nesby and the Muhlenberg High School boys' basketball team. Dr. Macharola said there are so many incredible things happening in the athletic department that he cannot keep up with all of the Tweets, but he wanted everyone to know that he is just thrilled to death with them all. Coach Nesby has turned the MHS boys' basketball program around. He is committed. He is dedicated. He puts his heart and soul into everything, and there is no question, he has done an incredible job with the kids and they really respond to him. Dr. Macharola thought he should have been named Coach of the Year last year, but is really happy that he has been named the State 5A Boys' Basketball Coach of the Year. He congratulated Coach Nesby on the incredible job he has done with the kids this year. Dr. Macharola said there is no question in his mind that Coach Nesby and the MHS incredible basketball team would have brought home the gold ball, the first prize - a state title - had COVID-19 not closed schools. He said congratulations to Coach Nesby, Coach Coldren, and to Mrs. Dennis.

Dr. Macharola said the District is not just about sports. The District is about the Arts and Humanities as well. Something very important was bestowed upon the Muhlenberg School District recently - more specifically, the high school. Muhlenberg High School was recently named a U.S. News & World Report Best High School for 2020. That will never be taken away. That is an earning this District has forever. He said if you look around the companies, hospitals that have a high standard and they receive a high ranking from the U.S. News & World Report, they are very proud of that - like the Reading Hospital - they let you know that. There has been so much to be proud of in Muhlenberg over the last five years and that is when this happened. The work every year that the teachers and the kids demonstrated is all researched based. Macharola said there is nothing more that can be said about this except that the facts speak for themselves. Muhlenberg has not only one of the best school districts but it has, unquestionably, one of the best high schools in the nation. He said this is the first time that Muhlenberg High School has achieved this award. There were 17,792 high schools in the United States ranked on six factors based on their performance on state assessments and how well those schools and institutions prepare students for college. Muhlenberg High School ranked 6,216 which gained them the recognition to be placed in the top forty percent. Dr. Macharola said there was an article in the Reading Eagle that he is still trying to figure out what the reporter was writing about as it made no sense at all and it did not mention anything about Muhlenberg or any of the schools that received this designation. It was baffling. He said he was going to clarify this for everyone and explain what exactly this means. Muhlenberg High School was thirty-five percent or in the sixty-fifth percentile. It is not failing. That is the recognition and the benchmark. Dr. Macharola said it is much like someone receiving a bronze medal, a silver medal or a gold medal. There are four seconds differentiating all three. He said he could just see someone complaining and saying, why you did not get the gold. Muhlenberg High School is there. It is one of the best high schools.

The methodology uses a holistic approach to evaluate schools on six factors: college readiness, reading and math proficiency (two pilots of the District's four pilots), reading and math performance, underserved student performance, college curriculum breadth and graduation rates. College readiness measures participation and performance on AP and IB exams. This distinction is clear evidence that our holistic Action Plan and Blueprint for Success are working. These investments that the Board has bought into and trusted administration with, there is now clear evidence that they are working and they are delivering. Dr. Macharola said our secondary students have many exciting opportunities, which include initiatives in literacy, math and science resulting in new and progressive programs in the district. Our students have also used technology throughout their academic career in the Muhlenberg School District and have experienced the emerging initiative of one-to-one capabilities for all. He could not be prouder of our high school students, our high school administration, our high school teachers and staff and their achievements! He said to all of the District's teachers and principals who work our students systemically every year up and they deliver up to the high school where it matters, this is a symbol of our District's integrity and promise for all our students to be able to pursue the American dream. Dr. Macharola said congratulations to the Muhlenberg School District, to the Muhlenberg High School and to the Muhlenberg community. This is something to be very proud of.

Dr. Macharola said he is very concerned about many things with regards to the COVID-19 pandemic. He said he is seeing what he considers to be a very, very dire time over the next few weeks. As he mentioned in his message to the community last Friday, Dr. Macharola said he is pleading with the community not only as a father, but as the superintendent to reach out if anyone is feeling depressed, lost or feel like there is nowhere else to go because students are penned up at home and the pandemic has created a challenge for everyone. He said it is just not something to talk about and he would like everyone to know what the District's counseling department and Behavior Specialist are involved in and why he is concerned when he looks at the data. There has been 382 virtual welfare check-ins; 414 counseling needs; 105 mental health concerns; 26 immediate needs concerns in terms of food, medical, shelter and counseling; 146 post-secondary concerns; and 92 scheduling questions. Dr. Macharola said his specific concern with the mental health concerns is that there was a 50 percent rise over the past week. He said he takes this very seriously and there has been no loss of life, not one. Again, Dr. Macharola asked the community to reach out if there are any issues as it is impossible to be in their homes. Everyone has a purpose on this planet and a life here. The data is clear. There is information on the District's website - reach out, please. He said the numbers are clearly stating those things he is concerned about and he will continue to be concerned over the next several weeks. Dr. Macharola said this includes the adults. Everyone is in this together. He said if we work as one we can help each other.

Dr. Macharola said Mr. Carey Kline has done a magnificent job along with the cafeteria staff and all of the administrators who have been helping out with the feeding program. He said he could not thank everyone enough for their commitment to the human spirit. Once a week two-hundred boxes are distributed from Health Harvest for needy families.

Mr. Kline, administrators, and the cafeteria staff are averaging 700 meals a day. The Muhlenberg School District is one of the few districts. We are managing the best we can with social distancing and wearing masks. Dr. Macharola said he tries to be there every day, but it's not always possible, but he knows that 700 meals are going out every day. He said some people have asked that he cut it down to one or two days a week, but he has said no because come Monday, sometimes they run out of everything. Dr. Macharola said the community comes every day for food, and the staff is doing everything they can as a District to help our community. The District needs to continue its commitment to its families. Dr. Macharola thanked Mr. Kline and his staff for all of their hard work. The staff is phenomenal.

Dr. Macharola said libraries are in danger, not only financially but the traditional libraries with books. He said we may be seeing a change in books on shelves as a result of COVID-19, given the virus and how long it lasts. How would 400 pages of a book be disinfected? This is stressing everyone in areas that no one ever thought of. Dr. Macharola said he is traditionalist – he believes in John Dewey, in holistic education, he still thinks that it is important to be one-to-one, but there is no question in his mind that the District must begin to prepare two ways in the fall. Dr. Macharola said administration is working on this now amongst all of the other things they are addressing, which is the end of this school year, prepare for a traditional start to the school year and potentially a hybrid. A hybrid is a heavy lift because it is also a burden on families. But if the pandemic continues and the county goes into yellow or green, the District still has concerns on a back swing. He said they will look at the data and they will deal with the data, but the challenges are incredible from transportation, busing, social distancing, children coming to school wearing masks, temperatures being taken by nurses (so the District will need another nurse as every school will need one), nutrition (how the children be spaced, what will that mean to the schedule), will we be flexing the schedule where kids come to school on A, B days (meaning some kids may be come to school Monday, Tuesday, or Wednesday, Friday) and work at home. Dr. Macharola said that is not known yet, but the District will be prepared for a traditional opening just like normal with all of our programs taking the next steps. He said he wanted everyone to understand what a heavy lift that is and what that will mean. Dr. Macharola said it does not necessarily mean costs savings and it doesn't mean loss of staffing, because there is virtual learning going on at the same time. The District's challenges are unbelievable, but leadership, vision, data from the Pennsylvania Department of Health, the guidance from the Pennsylvania Department of Education, House and Senate and the governor, and hopefully, from the House and Senate in Washington as well as the president the District will be able to continue to move forward with what the District needs and is obligated to do for its children. Dr. Macharola wanted everyone to understand exactly how much work is going on right now as he spoke not only to close the year, but what will the District look like at the start of the year and it is not an easy fix. It will take an awful lot of work, and following the letter of the law, revisions to the school code, and potentially what will it look like to even offer a safe learning environment. That is why many universities and colleges have already canceled traditional learning, but offering virtual. They just do not know what it will look like in higher education. Secretary Rivera made a statement in Pennsylvania only to be chastised by a politician about whether or not school would start in the fall. He said

school will start in the fall given certain health elements. Dr. Macharola said the data will really have to be studied so that children are safe. He said health and safety are the District's number one concern now and prior to the pandemic but, now with the pandemic there is no taking steps back or lessening that.

Dr. Macharola thanked everyone for their time as the District emerges and so that the community knows exactly what the District is doing.
