- B. Reading-Muhlenberg CTC Mrs. Cindy Mengle

Mrs. Mengle reported that the RMCTC will be virtual with teachers being in the building. She said she will update the Board as new items come up.

C. Berks County Tax Collection Committee - Mr. Shane M. Mathias, CPA

Mr. Mathias reported a meeting was held on July 30th via Zoom. He said there was an update on the new tax collection system software, which has been an ongoing issue for some time. Things seem to be working out really well with the new vendor. Mr. Mathias said they are anticipating completion and roll-out of the new system by December of 2020. He said Herbein and Company was there to report on the audit (Financial Statements for year ending December 31, 2019). They earned a clean opinion. Mr. Mathias said there were no financial statement findings and there was one compliance finding which was related to their software. This will be resolved when the new software is put into place. He said the Committee approved the audit report.

Comments/Questions/Concerns:

Mr. Hoffmaster asked Mr. Mathias if he figured out how much tax revenue the District will receive from the proposed Amazon building planned in Muhlenberg. Mr. Mathias said no he did not. At this point, there has been no change in the assessment and the only revenue the District will receive now is the transfer tax.

D. PSBA Liaison - Mr. Otto W. Voit, III

Mr. Voit said there has been a lot of information coming from PSBA via email relative to the opening of schools and the Corona Virus. He said there was nothing new to report and asked that everyone continue to read the information they have been receiving.

E. Muhlenberg Community Library - Mr. Terry Heckman/Mr. Randall R. Madara

No report at this time; however, they met on July 10 to discuss the damage from the rain. He said he believed the Library was being denied their insurance claim because it was a flood.

Mr. Lupia reported that Amazon has purchased the old Dekka building off Sofianos Lane for another distribution center,, which will have an estimated 600 employees with two shifts. He said the CarbonLite building on Route 61 is set to open and they are taking applications with a starting salary of \$15 per hour. Mr. Lupia said a building for plastic recycling which is a partner of CarbonLite would be opening behind Walmart

Comments/Questions/Concerns:

Dr. Macharola asked Mr. Houck to display the three pathways for the opening of schools. Dr. Macharola said Pathway 1 would be full traditional with a virtual option, all staff and students on site, students would have a virtual school option; Pathway 2 is a Hybrid Plan which would have students in school two days in person and three days virtual, students would be split into Group 1 and Group 2; and Pathway 3, would be full virtual learning with all staff onsite and all students offsite. Dr. Macharola asked Mr. Hardy to ask the Board to choose one of those pathways and vote.

Mr. Voit said if it was the will of the Chair, he wanted to make a motion for Pathway #3. Mr. Hardy agreed. Mr. Hoffmaster seconded the motion for Pathway #3.

Mr. Gross said that this was by far the most concerning and troubling issue the school board has faced in the years that he has been on the Board. He said he would like to open the classrooms and offer virtual learning for the students that are just not ready to go back to the classroom. There are many issues to consider before making a decision. Mr. Gross said he is concerned that all students may not have adequate access to the Internet; he was concerned that not all students could learn effectively in a virtual environment; he was concerned about working parents and the problems that this could cause; and he was concerned about students getting behind and not advancing a full grade level. Mr. Gross said with all of these concerns he would vote with the Board to keep the Board working towards one common goal – getting back to normal as soon as possible.

Mr. Hyneman said he would vote for Pathway #3; however, he said he had great emotion for families who have both parents working and have very young students who would be home alone. He said if it is appropriate, but if it not, would Mr. Boland step in, Mr. Hyneman said as a Board member, if he would be permitted to help, he may have a solution and would like to volunteer his input. He said when looking for solutions, he would like to volunteer to be part of the group that is working on solving that problem because he has a great deal of empathy for parents who are going through that.

Mr. Voit thanked Mr. Gross for his comments and he said he embraced them. He said also the same regarding Mr. Hyneman's comments. Mr. Voit said it pains him to have to vote for Pathway #3 because the Board and the community feel that the students need to get back to school. There are some students who will be far behind and there will be parents who will be in a very difficult position. He said through the lack of effort by the Governor, it doesn't leave the District with many options and he believed that for the first marking period, Pathway #3 is the safest way to go, but he assured everyone in the community that come the October meeting, he hoped the Board would be in

a position to vote for Pathway #1 which is a full return to school for the second quarter marking period.

Mr. Hardy said he agreed wholeheartedly. This is a tough decision to make. He said he has grandchildren in school who are going through the same thing. Mr. Hardy said this is not an easy thing and he is concerned about them and the the kids in the District. He said he knows it is a tough decision but, hopefully in October, they can go back to a full traditional opening – that is what the Board is shooting for.

Mr. Lupia said he thinks that everyone is letting this virus take the best of them. He said everyone is frightened – he realizes that, but by the same token everyone must be brave and strong with this decision. Mr. Lupia said if the District is concerned about charter schools taking over and they are accepting students, then the Muhlenberg School District should be accepting students. He said if the Board is concerned about working parents and whether they should stay home, then parents should make the decision about whether or not their children go to school. If the Board is concerned about students with special needs, teachers should be in their classroom because doing it virtually with some of these students is virtually impossible. Mr. Lupia said his parents had to go to school in the middle of a World War and their path to school was filled with great dangers. He said they did not know when they went around the corner, if they would see a soldier with a gun; or if they walked across a field and heard an airplane, they did not know if it was friend or foe. Mr. Lupia said they still sent to school despite the danger. He said he felt the District was letting this virus get the best of it and the District should hit it head on. He said the parents should make the decision for their kids and for that reason; he was going to vote no on Pathway #3.

Mr. Voit asked should the Board choose Pathway #1, would they have the support of the unions. Dr. Macharola said, no. He said of course he would have to ask them; but he highly doubted it. Dr. Macharola said the District would not be able to safe distance and would not be able to meet the matrix that was submitted by the Governor's Office and the Department of Health. He said if the District goes with Pathway #1, he would have to ask the Board to hold all of the administrators harmless and the two commissioned officers for any potential issues that would come out of that. Dr. Macharola said the District cannot safe distance and cannot implement Pathway #1 effectively under the guidelines that the District has now. Mr. Voit thanked Dr. Macharola and said he wholeheartedly agreed with Mr. Lupia, but without the support of the very people who will be in the classroom and without the support of the Governor, this is something the District should hold-off on until the second quarter, and he would vote yes to Pathway #3.

Mr. Lupia said that the District was just letting the virus take over. Mr. Nelson said this is not letting the virus take over – this is something that no one has ever seen before; 160,000 people in the U.S. have died from this. He said this is not something that anyone wants to do and the District is not running scared from it – it is a problem; and, until there is a vaccine, we will continue to have this problem.

Mr. Hoffmaster said there are nine Board members and they do not want to see anyone go to school and get sick or pass away. He said it is tough to make a decision but the Board will do the right thing for the kids. The Board would not want them to go to school and get sick or take something home to someone in their family. Mr. Hoffmaster said Mr. Nelson was right – this is something no one has ever seen before. This is a tough decision, but kids should not go to school. He said the District will try to get help for the special need students, but they cannot go to school and get sick. The District cannot afford to have kids or staff get sick.

Mr. Hardy said he agreed. The Board needed to look out for everyone's safety and well-being. He said it is a decision no one wanted to make.

Prior to the vote Mr. Voit requested that Dr. Macharola re-read the resolution. Mr. Voit stated he wanted to be sure he understood what he would be voting for or what he would be voting against. Dr. Macharola read Resolution No. 37 at this time.

When Dr. Macharola was finished reading the resolution, Mr. Voit asked who wrote the resolution. Dr. Macharola replied all eighteen superintendents participated with the IU to write the resolution. Mr. Voit said there was one sentence in the resolution that he would like Dr. Macharola to re-read which mentioned systemic racism as he wanted to make a motion to amend it. Dr. Macharola read, "Collectively, we share concern over how systemic racism and social injustices are impacting our Berks County schools and the community. As education leaders, we are obligated to have productive conversations around these inequities and the work that needs to be done to address them. Furthermore, we are committed to..." Mr. Voit asked if that was all that was the paragraph that referred to systemic racism and equities. Dr. Macharola replied, no, it goes the whole way through the resolution and if the Board would want, this resolution could be taken off the agenda. He said everyone could take a hard look at it and if the Board would want to approve it next month that would be fine and if not, this District would be the one district that did not approve it. Mr. Voit said he was only one vote. Mr. Hoffmaster stated that the Board should vote on it because it would not look good if the Muhlenberg School District is the only district that does not.

Mr. Nelson said there is already a motion and a second on the floor for the statement as it is written. Mr. Hoffmaster agreed and said the Board must vote on it.

Mr. Voit said he was making a motion to amend the resolution to eliminate the sentence referencing systemic racism in public schools because at Muhlenberg there is No Place for Hate and the District does not have systemic racism in this school district. He said he was not going to vote yes to say there is. Mr. Voit said he wanted to make a motion to amend the resolution to take out that sentence. Mr. Gross seconded the motion.

Mr. Boland said would the Board members, Mr. Hoffmaster and Mr. Nelson, who moved the resolution by signifying a first and a second agree to the amendment of the motion to remove the reference to systemic racism in Berks County schools.

Mr. Hoffmaster replied, no. Mr. Nelson said he did not agree.

Dr. Macharola replied the maintenance and custodial staff are working all of the time right now because the District must make sure the buildings are clean and that the campus is taken care of. He said they have been working since the onset of COVID-19 and they will continue to work in the capacity that they are. They have been very busy as the District has projects that they are taking care of. No one is sitting around. Dr. Macharola said the cafeteria will be on a rotation or a skeleton crew so that they are able to provide the meals for staff. Mr. Kline will get a menu out the day before to get a count of what will be needed the next day. After a few days, Mr. Kline will be able to get an idea of the staffing needs. The custodial and maintenance staff will continue working as there are still things going on that will need their attention.

Mr. Hoffmaster said he wanted to thank the administration and the administrative team for the tough job they had getting the plan ready for the Board to vote on. He said what the Board just did for three hours talking about the start of school will not be on the front page of the paper, but what will be, is the statement on racism. That is what will make the Board look bad; although it is just one small thing – the Board is against discrimination.

Mr. Voit said he agreed with Mr. Hoffmaster's sentiments and thanked the administration, the teachers, the custodians, the secretaries and the support staff who have and will continue to work hard on behalf of the students. The resolution will speak for itself. Muhlenberg does not have systemic racism. He said he did not care if it was a headline, but it should be about the kids and the great things that are happening at Muhlenberg – that Muhlenberg does not believe in racism or hate. The District practices it every single day at Muhlenberg. Mr. Voit complimented the entire staff on a job well done.
